In order to foster and emphasize dialogue on various social issues (*and to simply get to know each other*), the CTC presents The Parent Discussion Café (PDC). Typically a collaboration with University departments, the Baha'i Center, faith-based communities and student organizations; All help to bring together speakers from multiple disciplines. Parent Discussion Café features (refreshments) & lively discussions on a variety of topics that relate to the UN



theme calendar (*ie: Race Unity, Education, Human Rights, World Religion etc*). The Series will take place over the course of 10 rehearsal afternoons, while children are in rehearsal.

- The Myth of Human Rights
- Unity in Diversity: Fable or Reality

PARENT CONFERENCE HOME VISIT

CTC Staff and Associate Directors are required to submit weekly evaluations on the progress of their students and their project status. At the onset of their enrollment-parents will be setting goals for the character development of their child, and selecting a day (by mid-season) for a 'Home Visit' made to each child's home - designed to create a more affirming and supportive sense of community and subsequently a more encouraging environment for growth and transformation.
